### Library Ready For Use

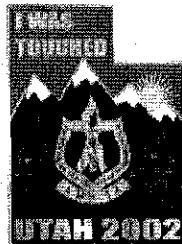

## Utah Chapter Pushes Forward with Implementation of Massage Emergency Response Team

Last year, when the chapter officers returned from the national convention in Phoenix, they carried with them an implementation schedule for the Massage Emergency Response Team (MERT) program. MERT is a group of massage therapists that have gone through several hours of training in emergency response and dealing with governmental agencies that control situations in response to emergency situations such as earthquakes, bombings, fires, floods, and many other types of disasters.

MERT was born out of the big earthquake in Los Angeles. Several massage therapists banded together and began working with rescuers. The first response of the newly formed MERT was in the recent earthquake in Seattle. Last Saturday, our chapter had a meeting scheduled with the President of the New York Chapter of AMTA. He never made it due to the WTC attack. Instead, he

remained in New York and activated his MERT to aid rescue personnel.



At that very meeting, the Utah Chapter unveiled it's pin. It reads, "I was touched in 2002." These pins are now on sale for \$5 each. At that price you can turn around and sell the pin for a profit. All the proceeds are going to fund the implementation of MERT. In total, we estimate that to kick off this program, it will cost \$5,000. We hope that the sale of the pins will bring in enough money to defer the cost of the training

from individuals to the Utah Chapter. In light of the events of the past week, we were happy to announce the kick off of the MERT plan next year. Many training sessions will be provided, hopefully at no cost to AMTA therapists, including disaster drills with local agencies. This program is sweeping the nation. ## **Changes in Utah Massage Legislation:**

**Additions and amendments in effect as of August 16, 2001**

After the legislation period in early 2001, the Massage Therapy Licensure Act Rules have now gone into effect as of August 16<sup>th</sup> 2001. There have been some additions in the massage rules regarding our profession. It is important to know these changes that may affect you and the way you operate as a massage therapist. Here is what you need to know:

### **Licensed Massage Therapists are now able to practice massage on animals.**

A joint addendum to the Veterinarian Practice Act, along with chiropractic and physical therapy has gone into effect. A licensed massage therapist, having received some additional animal massage training may now practice in the state of Utah. The educational requirements are:

"In accordance with Subsection 58-28-8(12)(c), a massage therapist practicing animal massage shall have received 60 hours of training in the following areas:

- Quadruped anatomy
- The theory of quadruped massage
- Supervised quadruped massage experience."

**There have been changes to the rules in the area of unprofessional conduct,** and they are as follows:

- Engaging in any lewd, indecent, obscene or unlawful behavior while acting as a massage therapist
- As an apprentice supervisor, failing to provide direct supervision to a massage apprentice
- As an apprentice supervisor, failing to provide and document adequate instruction or training as applicable
- As an apprentice supervisor, advising, directing or instructing an apprentice in any instruction or behavior that is inconsistent, contrary or contradictory to established professional or ethical standards of the profession
- Failing to notify a client of any health condition the licensee may have that could present a hazard to the client;
- failure to use appropriate draping procedures to protect the client's personal privacy

**The State of Utah has, as of July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2001, required all applicants for licensure for massage therapy to pass the National Certification**

### **Examination rather than the Utah Massage Theory Exam**

One exception will be for massage apprentices, as they do not qualify under the National Certification Exam.

It needs to be understood that if you are already a licensed therapist in the State of Utah, you do not have to take the National Certification Examination.

These are additions that pertain to our profession in this state; we would like to thank the efforts of our Chapter's **Law and Legislation committee**, as well as that of our **Lobbyist, Lloyd Selleneit**. Many thanks for your hard work and commitment to the profession of massage therapy.

64 feet by 24 feet. There will be two-six hour shifts per day. Approximately 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m..

**Sports massage services will be offered beginning January 29 through March 17.** We are asking that any therapist (this is open to ALL therapists not only those members of the AMTA) wishing to participate to be willing to sign up for a minimum of seven shifts. These shifts may be on consecutive days or may be split between different days. Please note that this is a one time commitment of 7 shifts, not 7 shifts per week. In addition, local therapists are being asked to provide at least two of those shifts during the Paralympic Games from March 1 through March 17.

**This is a wonderful opportunity for anyone interested in working with world class athletes. We must have a list of people to SLOC by October 5. I am asking that you call me, email me, or send me your "application" as soon as you can. We are opening this to people from outside Utah as well.**

**The information that is required immediately is the following:** Last Name, First Name, Name on Passport, Former Name, Gender, Date of Birth, Passport Number, Passport Expiry Date, Passport Country (Nationality), Social Security Number, City of Birth, County of Birth, City of Residence.

**This information must be emailed, called into, or sent to us before October 5.** (If there is a difficulty meeting this deadline, contact Roger or Jennifer ASAP! We will also need to know if you would like to have meals during your shifts. The cost will be \$3 for breakfast, and \$7 for lunch and dinner. (Vegetarian meals will be available.) Meals will be on your own but will be served at the Staff Dining Room within the Village. (No outside food will be allowed into the Village.) Uniforms are required as well and we have to pay for these ourselves. For men, we need to know your inseam size (inches) and waist size (inches), and polo shirt size S, M, L, XL, etc. For women, we need to know your pant sizes 2,4,6,8,10, etc. and polo shirt size S, M, L, XL, etc. (We are trying to keep the cost of the uniform down

to \$60 for pants and shirts. Sweat shirts for layering will also be available for purchase. If you desire more than one pant or shirt, please indicate that to us.) And finally, will you need housing here in Salt Lake City? We are trying to find accommodations at local houses for out of town people. We will put you in touch with your host and let you go from there. **Email this information to [message2002@usa.net](mailto:message2002@usa.net) or send it to Roger or Jennifer at the addresses below.**

### **By November 1st, we will need the following information:**

The criteria for acceptance includes:

- 1)**You must be licensed in your locale as applicable (e.g. state, county, city);
- 2)**You must have attended a school where you have successfully completed a minimum of a 500 hours of education and provide proof;
- 3)**You must submit a resume with experience
- 4)**Submit a copy of your current license valid through March 2002
- 5)**Submit a copy of your current insurance certificate valid through March 2002
- 6)**Submit a single page letter, double spaced stating why you wish to be considered for this opportunity
- 7)**You must be able to pass an FBI background check

NOTE: The above seven items will be required once your initial information has been accepted.

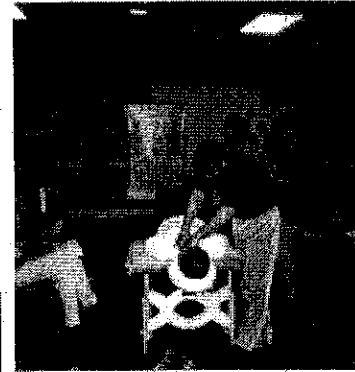
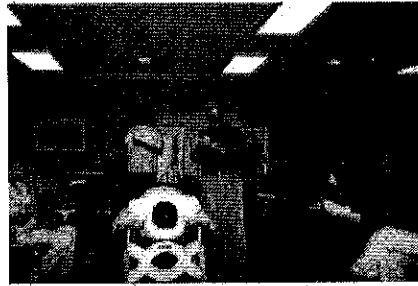

His instruction covered muscular and nerve components of the cervical spine region. The training qualified for five hours of Category A Continuing Education Credits.

**Course Highlights:** Those in attendance learned assessment methods for isolating and treating problem areas involved in carpal tunnel and thoracic outlet syndromes, as well as an in-depth protocol for the neck region. Ivan went over symptoms of specific cervical nerve impingement and the difference between muscular and nerve problems. Based on the enthusiasm and feedback of participants, it is easy to conclude that "The course was a big hit."

come at a later date. The first refresher class will be held on November 17. (See the article on page 4 for more information.)

The FBI criminal background check includes the following:

1. Specific Felony Conviction for any of the following: Homicide, Crime Against Person, Sexual Offense, Child Molestation, Robbery, Arson, Assault Conviction, Battery, Drug Offense
2. Any arrest for any of the offenses listed in Item 1 in which there is no disposition.
3. Any outstanding felony warrant.
4. Any two felony convictions (of any kind).
5. Any felony conviction within the past 10 years.
6. Any misdemeanor conviction within the past 5 years for any of the following: Crime Against Person, Sex Offense, Weapon Violation, Property Crime, Fraud, Child Abuse, Gambling, Drug Offense

And, for positions requiring the operation of a SLOC motor vehicle,

7. Any misdemeanor conviction within the past 5 years for Driving Under the Influence (DUI) Offense.

If you plan on applying for the massage team you will be required to meet the above requirements as they pertain to a background check.

**Remember! We need your fast response and intent to participate by OCTOBER 5, 2001! Then your application and supporting documentation is due by NOVEMBER 1, 2001. Again, contact Roger Olbrot (801-916-8752) or Jennifer Pruetz (801-573-7382) stating your interest. Thank you for your participation and we'll see you at the Olympic Village!**

### *Cadaver Anatomy Seminar*

- Teach basic human dissection techniques.
